

WEDNESDAY TWILIGHT PICNIC HIKE
July 21st at Jack London State Park

Take a walk on the wild side at twilight on Wednesday, July 21st to celebrate the 50th Anniversary of Jack London State Park. The free, docent led, hike through redwood groves, along creeks and across meadows will delight wildlife enthusiasts who may experience sightings of deer, jack rabbits and coyote. The 1 ½ hour easy to moderate hike will cover the Quarry Trail from the lake, returning on the Fallen Bridge Trail, the Mountain Trail and down around the Upper Lake Trail. The adventure will end at the picnic tables near the parking lot where we will enjoy a bring-your-own-picnic. Hikers are asked to meet at 5:15pm in the upper parking lot for a 5:30pm departure. We have special permission to hike in the park after the usual 5pm closure, but must exit the park by 8pm. The free docent-led hikes are co-sponsored by the California State Parks and the Valley of the Moon Natural History Association.
